


3.1. MULTI-SECTORAL HUMAN RESOURCES & SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

KAIZEN INSTITUTES

- China, India, Malaysia, Singapore, Vietnam
- Ethiopia 40,000 workers trained in 3 yrs
- Set-up Kaizen Institutes in Dhaka & Chittagong with JICA Assistance
- Kaizen Certification
- Reduce Foreign Managerial & Technical dependency
- Joint Collaboration to upgrade existing divisional Bangladesh Institutes of Management (BIM) under Industries Ministry, into Centres of Excellence

TRAINING OF TRAINERS (TOT) INSTITUTIONS

- Japan has set-up TOT Institutions in ASEAN KL, Malaysia
- JICA may be requested to replicate in Bangladesh with Japanese industry standards/certification
